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Safety:

Did you know that the majority of accidents at RC flying fields are tripping and falling from uneven ground? Of course, we are not looking forward to get hit with a prop or another plane, so most of the time we are aware of our surroundings and hazards, but sometimes we are not.



Apart from the occasional prop strike to the finger, here at RCACF, we have been quite safe in terms of accidental injuries. No one likes a Gestapo attitude at the field from a safety officer who harasses you instead of calling you apart and letting you know that you may have pushed the limits and therefore increasing the risk of injury. 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THE FRIA PROCESS:

As most know, compliance with the Remote ID rule will be required beginning in September 2023. In anticipation of the requirement, AMA has begun requesting FAA-Recognized Identification Areas (FRIA) on behalf of our chartered clubs. We ask that those who have submitted their club's FRIA questionnaire to AMA to please be patient. This process will take many months to complete. After AMA has submitted your club's questionnaire for FAA review, the applicant will be notified of submission. Please keep in mind that the FAA will not begin processing these applications until summer 2023, so it might be some time before you are notified of your FRIA approval or denial.

The RCACF has it's application in and we are just waiting on the FAA. Keep flying until the powers to be get off their keesters and get the job done!
